Located in central Hokkaido, the Taisetsu area boasts the Daisetsuzan National Park, one of Japan's largest national parks. It is home to the city of Asahikawa in the west and a total of eight towns. Blessed with abundant nature, this region nurtured the culture of the Ainu people living there. The terrain surrounded by mountains and rivers offers endless possibilities for activities, from mountain climbing and cycling in the summer to skiing on the finest powder snow in the winter.



Hokkaido Garden Path

The Hokkaido Garden Path is a collection of eight of Hokkaido's most beautiful gardens along a 250 km route stretching from Daisetsu to Tokachi via Furano. Two of the gardens are found in the Taisetsu area.

6 Daisetsu Mori-no Garden

Open: Late April to mid-October
Nestled in a hillside forest, this garden offers a panoramic view of the Daisetsuzan Mountain Range. There are three areas to enjoy: the vibrant Forest Flower Garden, a Forest Guesthouse surrounded by natural trees and wildflowers, and a Play Forest ideal for family fun.
